Tast Fashion's Hidden Waste

Global Impact

- ## 100 billion garments produced each year.
- **2** 92 million tonnes of textiles wasted annually.
- That's 1 rubbish truck of clothes landfilled or burned every second.

UK Impact

- Households discard 1.7 million tonnes of textiles annually.
- ™ 300,000 tonnes go to landfill each year (≈ 30 kg per household).
- Average person buys 26.7 kg of clothing per year much is thrown away within 12 months.

X Jersey Estimate

- Population ~110,000.
- Proportional to UK averages: ~3,300 tonnes of clothing may go to landfill annually.
 - Recycling banks exist, but not all clothes are captured.

Key Takeaway

- = Extending clothing life by 9 months reduces its carbon, water & waste
 footprint by 20–30%.
 - Repair, donate, resell, and recycle instead of binning.

Make Fashion More Sustainable

For Consumers

- Buy Less, Choose Well → Invest in high-quality pieces that last.
 - ቆ Second-Hand & Vintage → Charity shops, resale apps, swaps.
 - Repair & Upcycle → Mend or repurpose instead of discarding.
- The Sustainable Materials → Organic cotton, hemp, linen, recycled fibres.
- Support Ethical Brands → Look for transparency & eco-certifications.

For the Fashion Industry

- - Better Materials → Low-impact fabrics & recycled textiles.
 - Sustainable Packaging → Minimal, recyclable, or reusable.
 - Take-Back Schemes → Brand recycling/repair programs.

P Big Wins

- Extending garment life 9 months → 20–30% less carbon, water & waste.
- Washing at 30°C or lower → up to 60% energy saved per load.
- Buying 1 in 5 clothes second-hand → saves billions of litres of water & reduces emissions.

Key Takeaway

Buy less, buy better, make it last, recycle what you can.

Upcycling Old Clothes — Tips & Ideas

1. Restyle & Transform

- "Cut & Sew: Turn jeans into shorts, skirts, or tote bags."
- Dye & Paint: Refresh faded items with fabric dye or paints.
- Add Embroidery/Patches: Cover worn spots or add unique designs.

2. Repair & Reinforce

- Mend Tears/Holes: Extend garment life with basic stitching.
- 🔁 Replace Buttons/Zippers: Make clothes wearable again.

3. Accessorize & Repurpose

- T-Shirts → Bags: Easy sewing or no-sew projects.
 - Old Fabrics → Scarves/Headbands
 - Sweaters → Mittens/Gloves

4. Mix & Match

- Layer Old & New Pieces: Refresh your wardrobe.
- TREPUTPOSE INTO HOME ITEMS: Pillowcases, cushions, quilts.

5. Share & Donate

- <u>**111**</u> Clothing Swaps: Exchange with friends or community events.
- Lonate to Charity Shops: Give garments a second life (see Jersey shops list).
